# THE INTERNET

# CYBERBULLYING

Cyberbullying is the most common type of abuse noted online. Cyberbullying is when someone uses technology, like the internet or a mobile phone, to deliberately hurt, humiliate, harass, intimidate or threaten someone else.

It is different from bullying at school or in the community because it can happen at any time of the day or night and it may cause a child to feel like they can't get away from it. This may leave them feeling scared and unsafe at home as they can still receive hurtful comments if through text messages or messages online.

- 1) Tell an adult you trust if you are being cyberbullied
- 2) Don't respond or retaliate it could make things worse
- 3) Block users who send you nasty messages
- 4) Save abusive emails or messages (or texts) you receive
- 5) Make a note of dates and times you receive bullying messages, as well as user's ID
- 6) Don't pass on any cyberbullying videos or messages – this is cyberbullying
- 7) Change your user ID, or profile and use a name that doesn't give any information away
